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Blended learning is a combination of online learning with in-class learning. The online discussion forum is a means for our class to interact and to share and extend some of the concepts we learn in class. Students are required to do the required readings and add to the discussion forum on a regular basis using appropriate language, research, and citations. There should be evidence of introspection and synthesis of ideas “meaning that you are not just regurgitating what you are reading” “I want to see your personal reflection and concrete examples from your own experience to support or refute the different point of views.”

## **Total Possible Discussion Points to be earned per Discussion Topic – 20 points**

- An average of points will be given for each of the discussion forum. Maximum 20 points per discussion forum. Please see the rubric.
- More than one post will be needed for each forum. You are reflecting on your experiences and constructing your understanding of the concept discussed. With each post added to the thread, the inquiry question will be clearer and clearer.
- APA citations and bibliography are used for the initial post as well as the reply to posts.
- 0 points are awarded if there are no posts throughout the duration of the forum or if the initial post is on final hour of the last day of the discussion.
